Most Holy Trinity – May 30th & 31st, 2026

1. Today you were given a prayer card with a picture of the visitation of Mary to her cousin, Saint Elizabeth. We encourage you to pray in a special way for intentions related to the dignity of life. You may pray the rosary for the protection of life from conception to natural death, an end to abortion and euthanasia, the conversion of hearts and minds who do not recognize the dignity of life, courage for those in positions of power to promote the dignity of life, healing and forgiveness for those in need of it and who seek it, and hope for those facing difficult circumstances.
2. Until Sunday, June 21, the MAiD Safeguards petition will be available at the back of the Church. The petition asks the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan to implement two safeguards, similar to those already in place in other Canadian provinces.
 - First - Prohibit unsolicited offers of MAiD to any patient. (If the patient does not bring up MAiD, healthcare professionals would not be allowed to offer or ask the patient about MAiD, or the possibility of choosing MAiD.)
 - Second - Protect healthcare providers who choose not to aid in the provision of MAiD from professional or legal repercussions.

All parishioners are invited and encouraged to sign this petition.
